RESEARCH WEEK- YOU ARE NOT GOING TO WANT TO MISS THIS!

Plans for Research Week are coming together, and we want to share details about our event that will happen on Friday, November 22nd, for parents and families. This event will be one you will not want to miss. On this day, we'll welcome families not only for student presentations, as usual, but we're also hosting parent information sessions before student presentations. All families are encouraged to attend these sessions, not just families of upper school students. The presentations will provide families with critical information about supporting their children with their education and life journey after BBA and graduation.

Our first speaker, **Missy Wrigley**, has worked with **SERC** and their **Transition Initiative**, helping families prepare for post-school success. She emphasizes starting transition discussions early, ideally in upper elementary or middle school.

Our second speaker, **Jennifer Sullivan**, owner of **Fast Forward College Coaching**, specializes in executive functioning and metacognition. Her insights apply to students from kindergarten through college. She is also offering a free webinar on note-taking on November 10th.

Various community resources will be available for parents to explore during student presentations.

These sessions are a valuable opportunity for parents to learn how to support their child's future. Given busy schedules and travel distances, we're sharing this information early.

Since 2008, Missy Wrigley has worked as a consultant with SERCs Transition Initiative with a primary goal of ensuring all student with disabilities obtain the skills needed to successfully achieve their post-school goals. She has served as co-facilitator of the CT State Transition Task Force and she is a frequent collaborator with the CT State Department of Education and key stakeholders across the state to support the development of effective transition planning and services. She brings a wealth of information to inform and guide parents and families of students of all ages on the process of transition planning.

From kindergarten through high school, executive functioning skills are essential for mastering skills and tasks that allow students to demonstrate their learning. As academic demands increase, students who struggle with executive functions may experience frustration and decreased self confidence. Metacognitive strategies can complement practical executive functioning tools to help students better manage their learning processes, increase confidence and motivation, and improve overall performance. **Jennifer Sullivan** is the owner of Fast Forward College Coaching, an accomplished author, and a provider of executive functioning support to students both in-person and virtually. She offers families, students, and schools guidance and information on using metacognitive strategies to support executive function and performance in a traditional school setting and beyond.
















HOUSE THE DRAGON

Art Club Unleashes Creativity: From Tie-Dye to Sculptures!

Our Art Club has begun and is already bursting with creativity, taking on exciting new projects that blend color, texture, and imagination. Students dove into the club's start with a tie-dye session, designing their own one-of-a-kind shirts that are as unique as their creators. The explosion of colors was just the start! They will use the Cricut machine to add iron-ons of their names to their shirts as well.

Next, our young artists channeled their skills into sculpting by crafting intricate, three-dimensional works of art. But they didn't stop there—each student then painted stunning close-ups, 2D portraits of their sculptures, capturing the fine details and unique features of their creations.

Each artist had the chance to present their sculptures alongside the detailed, close-up paintings they created. In these presentations, students described the inspiration behind their sculptures, the techniques they used to bring their vision to life, and how they translated the three-dimensional forms into striking 2D artwork. This process encouraged them to think critically about their work, practice writing across the curriculum, and communicate clearly and confidently. Presenting their sculptures and paintings allowed them to refine their public speaking skills, express their creative choices, and gain valuable feedback from their peers.

Mastering the Magic of Narrative Writing




Narrative writing is a powerful style that allows writers to tell a compelling story, whether based on real events in chronological order or imagined scenarios crafted by the author. The goal is to captivate readers, painting vivid pictures with words and pulling them into the story.



This month, our students are diving into this form of writing in their classes, honing their skills, experimenting with creative techniques, and using the Self-Regulated Strategy Development (SRSD) teaching method. Students are introduced to graphic organizers with guiding questions to help them break down the steps into manageable parts and organize their ideas. Modeling, repetition, scaffolding, and feedback are part of our everyday practice in writing. Students also explored attention-grabbing strategies with the support of their mediator to help them develop engaging openings and thought-provoking questions to hook their readers from the start.

The Student Buddy Program is back for its second year and more popular than ever! This exciting initiative focuses on building friendships and fostering connections through supportive mentorship, engaging interactions, and fun challenges.
